create a commission to look at the problem, you can see the complexity of the issues that are involved. This is the exact same thing that we ran into in the Transportation Committee. We had a variety of issues that came up. We had a variety of reasons why there would be no legislation where the finger of blame was pointed, and so the idea behind the commission was to look at how do we get everybody together without them...with them all in one place, with the agencies that are affected, with the prosecuting attorneys that are affected, with the law enforcement, with senators that have an interest in this, with there are members of the general public that are there that are able to look at this also. An issue like this comes to us because people are finding themselves in a situation where they have felt victimized. They find themselves in a situation where they have been in an accident and there is a person that does not have proper insurance; they find themselves hit by a person that has not got a driver's license. We have cities saying they have cars that are unin...unlicensed. This issue is statewide. In fact, it's actually nationwide. Many states are struggling with the same problem. I would be surprised if there is anyone here that has not had a constituent come to them about this issue, and I say that because, as I said, we've received hundreds of letters about this concern. I realize that LB 704 is very important. I also feel that the idea behind this is very important. We are responsible for addressing the concerns of our constituents, and this is a concern that has come to me over and over again. I'm trying to find a reasonable way to do this. I'm certainly open to other suggestions about this. As I said, this bill was amended out of committee to...or advanced out of committee with the amendment to change the date but, again, there was the...especially following the testimony we had, everybody agreed it's a problem but what we have to come to agreement on is how to solve that problem. So I'm hoping we'll have more debate to open up some different ideas about where we can go with this. I don't think we can just say, well, we can't do anything. It's a real problem but we can't do anything, and so I'm hoping that we'll have some good discussion on the floor and I'm looking forward to hearing some different ideas from other senators.
