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about farming now. We're talking about people who want to get as much in the way of financial gain as they can.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I think that person who worked that farm and made a go of it understands, now that he's getting out of it, that it's not going to go like that in the hands of somebody else. Otherwise, he wouldn't be getting out of it. And if there's nobody to leave it to, he's not going to suffer any loss to help this young person. All he's going to do is say, I will let you work for me for three years so I can get a tax break for three years. And that's not helping the person who Senator Wehrbein wants to help. But I'm going to give it a vote, and then I'll go do penance. I'll fast and I'll pray (laugh), and then I'll feel a lot better perhaps.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Madam President, members. I understand some of the frustration here. I'll...that's how I'll quantify it, because there is frustration out there as to what best can be done. And I'll make a couple of comments. One, on page 13 of my AM1477: "the board shall"...this is the Agriculture Board..."shall conduct a study in order to ascertain the fiscal impact of future tax credits granted by the board to owners of agricultural assets. Such study shall attempt to reasonably estimate the number of qualified beginning farmers or livestock producers that would be eligible to enter into a board approved and certified three-year share-rental"...and now "cash"..."agreement with an owner of agricultural assets and other such relevant facts and information". So the...some of the burden is on the board here to look at these and to give this study. And I understand Senator Bromm. You know, there was a round table discussion of about 50 to 100 people here last September in this building, representing all facets, all facets of agriculture, trying to come up with some ideas on what...and they settled on this one, because I too...they too are frustrated. And I will be the first to admit that this is probably the...from my perspective, just the tip of the iceberg of what I expect things that I'm going to be asking to do. Senator Dierks has LB 835. I've got a task force bill that
