

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE  
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SENATOR COORDSEN: We...for the members of the body, Senator Raikes and I have had this discussion in the past and his concern and my concern also is that this is participation in a joint study and recognizing a problem, and we wish to encourage dollar contributions from these other entities which are primarily agricultural checkoff fees, Senator. And so, since the university indicated to the Natural Resources Committee a study of this size would...or this type would have a cost of about \$40,000, this is the best language that we could find to encourage the other entities to participate jointly with us.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay, Senator, then if I understand you correctly, if the other entities decided not to go along with this study, decided not to contribute funds to the study, then the state would not contribute.

SENATOR COORDSEN: It would be my intent that that would be exactly what would happen, Senator, that we would not try to conduct a study with only \$10,000.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. Thank you very much.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Raikes. (Visitors introduced.) Senator Coordsen, I don't see any further lights. Do you wish to close? We are voting on the Coordsen amendment to the committee amendments. All in favor of the Coordsen amendment please vote aye, those opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Coordsen's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Coordsen amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Schrock would move to amend the committee amendments, Mr. President, AM1438. (AM1438, Legislative Journal page 1709.)
