CLERK: LB 740, Mr. President. Senator Smith, I have no amendments to that bill.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I move the advancement of LB 740 to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Question is the advancement of LB 740 to E & R. Those in favor say aye. Those opposed nay. The bill is advanced. Mr. Clerk, LB 36.

CLERK: Mr. President, with respect to LB 36, Senator Smith, I have Enrollment and Review amendments first of all, Senator. (AM7114, Legislative Journal page 1414.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of E & R amendments to LB 36.
