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LB 476, 878

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right, okay, yeah. And this does seem like an awful lot of money. I...when LB 476 was being discussed, it seems to me they were going to train these people for...it was...the cost of that was going to be under a million dollars. And I know that that would have been just handguns, at that time, it wouldn't have been any automatic weapons, things like that. And I realize that it probably takes a better facility to do that. But I just wonder what, if we weren't having to address this situation, if this would really come about, would you be willing, in Appropriations Committee, would you be looking at something, if we weren't going to construct this facility at Tecumseh, would you be looking at running an A bill to facilitate new train...another new training center anyway?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, I can check on that, Senator Janssen. I would assume that that issue would have come up in due time, if we hadn't been building new. But I'd have to check to verify that for sure. I did ask that question, and as far as I know there's not a deadline out there on the present site,...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...except the fact that I know, if you understand today too, in today's age, anytime you have those things going on, there is increasing risk as population moves in around you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Absolutely. But, no, I don't imagine that they would be zoning anything close to that area anyway because that site is there. Senator Schmitt, could I...thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Schmitt, could I ask you a few questions, beings you're familiar with this situation? I'll give you a little time to get back to your...back to your desk, your microphone.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Schmitt, you mentioned how many...how many sites do we have right now where this training could take place?
