Lincoln and in Omaha. The last individual is William Heine, whose appointment is to the Board of Emergency Medical Services. William was born in Stromsburg, Nebraska, and currently farms in York County. He was reappointed by Governor Johanns to the EMS Board and previously served on the Board of Advanced Emergency Care from November 1994 to October 1997. He has been a member of the Waco Volunteer Fire Department since 1982 and currently is a farmer in York County. Mr. President, I would wish to advance these names for your confirmation.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I just stand in support of William Heine. He is a very fine individual from my district who, as Senator Jensen reported, has been involved in volunteer firefighters and also in medical services. So I certainly support his confirmation. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, for reasons that I've stated in the past relative to these types of appointments I'm going to vote "no", but it has no connection to the qualification and suitability of the individuals being appointed.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Further debate? Senator Jensen waives closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the second portion of the Health Committee's confirmation report. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: (Record vote, Legislative Journal pages 1851-1852.) 30 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of the confirmation report.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Confirmation report is adopted. We next move to Select File appropriations bill, LB 630A, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Smith, I have no amendments to LB 630A.
