PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Discussion on FA189? Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close. Senator Chambers waives closing. The question is the adoption of FA189 to LB 44. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Voting on the Chambers amendment. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Discussion on the advancement of LB 44? Senator Chambers, would you like to make a motion?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I move that LB 44 be advanced.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Question is the advancement of LB 44. Those in favor say aye. Those opposed nay. The bill is advanced. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Bill...Legislative Bill 87...LB 87A, excuse me, on Select File. Senator Wickersham, I...first amendment I have is AM1511, but I have a note you want to withdraw one, Senator.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct, withdraw that one.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator Wickersham would move to amend with AM1643, Mr. President. Mr. President, with respect to the offering of AM1643, Senator Wickersham would move to suspend the germaneness rule to permit consideration of AM1643.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wickersham, you're recognized to open on your motion to suspend the germaneness rule.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Mr. President. I'm bringing this motion, as much as anything, as a precautionary measure because the amendment strikes all the contents of LB 87A and obviously that was an appropriation bill at one time. All of
