So having said those things, I will now withdraw my motion.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The motion is withdrawn. Pursuant to Rule 6, Section 8, the question is, shall LB 880E be considered for a vote without an at-large reading? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 44 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, to dispense with Final Reading.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The question is agreed to. Mr. Clerk, please read the title.

CLERK: (Read title of LB 880.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 1998.) 49 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the passage of LB 880.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is passed. Pursuant to Rule 6, Section 8, the question is, shall LB 878 be considered for a vote without an at-large reading? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.
