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think, of egregiousness. Secondly, you might also tell them this, that if they are just discovering what the law is, they'd better get...they'd better go back and do some more work in their lobbying group because they now sell lottery tickets and those same clerks sell lottery tickets. If those clerks violate the law for lottery tickets, there's the power to temporarily suspend their lottery ticket power, not with second offense but with first offense. Something I've never heard retailers complain about. If their...if their clerks now sell cigarettes, the state can temporarily suspend their power to sell cigarettes on the first offense, not the second offense. Their clerks now have in their control several...several of their licensed powers subject to a discipline with a temporary suspension on first offense, not second offense. In fact, of all the licenses the state will grant, that clerk serving for them probably has more chances to screw up in the liquor area than in any place else where we license. We license them on bingo. We license them on...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...we license them on liquor. We license them on cigarettes. We license them on liq...on lottery cards and this is the only place where it kicks in on the second offense. If they're worried, they should check themselves because they should be worried about lots of other things before they get to this.

SENATOR BROWN: So...so that, basically, someone who has never had an offense before is probably worrying unduly about this.

SENATOR LANDIS: Absolutely. Remember, this has to be a repeat offender in a limited window of time and, secondly, even of the repeat offenders in the limited window of time, it's a discretionary piece which, I understand from the commission, they're going to use essentially in egregious circumstances, and there are some, and I'll be happy to tell a couple of stories.

SENATOR BROWN: And so the discretion would be around the nature of the offense or how...how serious it was.

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes, in my communication with the Commission,
