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they were legitimately of age. Well, that was the intent of that...of that piece, of that tool, and as it evolved over time, why it has been used as another offense. In my opinion and from what I have been told, that was not what it was intended for in the first place. It was intended as a defense for that...for that retailer, that person who is selling alcohol. And as Senator Brashear had alluded to, you know, we...when these kind of things...when these kind of things happen in the retail sector, it puts undue burden upon someone who is paying taxes, a lot of taxes. It's not only the lottery tickets that you have to abide by those rules, it is not only tobacco and it's not only alcohol, but we also have to abide by other rules set down by the Department of Agriculture, the Bureau of Dairy and Foods, there are regulations we have to follow there, so that, after all, you know, we can't...this is something we try to do is to keep people healthy in this state also, not get them sick. E-coli, that new bacteria, that's something, you know, and that is in the destiny of the people's hands who buy meat. All you have to do is cook it. If you don't want to get in trouble with alcohol, don't drink it or drink it in moderation. If you don't want to get hooked on tobacco, don't buy it. This is, you know, how much...how much can we do to protect people from themselves? You know I wonder. You have the violations, the violations that have occurred, as I said before, 100 percent of those violations in retail grocery stores in the Omaha area were from compliance checks. That tells me, that sends me a message that minors are obtaining alcohol in other ways than going in and buying it. When a compliance check is run, they are not going to use someone who looks like he's 12-years-old who could be 18, not going to do that. They're going to use someone, don't kid me, they're going to use someone who looks like he is 25-years-old. Otherwise, if they took the average 18-year-old off the street, it'd be a dead ringer. I tell you what, they'd have him in two seconds. They'd run his rear out of that place as fast, faster than he came in. So you see it's not...it's not all a fair game and that is what I'm going to try to find out this summer exactly how those...I think that maybe we should look at, if a violation is from a compliance check, there should be separate or different fines for that...for that action. If that person, if the minor is picked up with alcohol in his possession and he says I got it from ABC Liquor Store on 5th and K Street, why, fine, then that person is really in violation and that young
