grader, every eighth grader, but we would do a random sampling. And then we would have a statewide result that would show from year to year if the state of Nebraska is improving since we've had standards. That would be far less expensive, far less time consuming. However,...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...it would require one...one assessment, as you did that random sampling. That's just a thought that...it was not my original thought, actually. It came through a discussion with some educators on other things that we may consider. And over the interim, I hope that's one that may be presented to schools, as well as the ones that are in the amendments currently on the bill. Thank you for your questions. I hope I've been able to clearly lay out for you the plan that we have here, and I would ask for your support of the amendment and then the adoption of the bill.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. The question is the adoption of the Bohlke amendment to LB 144. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Have you voted? Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bohlke's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to.
