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a concern about public entities that own land in another political subdivision. And the example is perfect with Lincoln. Lincoln owns roughly 400 or 500 acres of land in Saunders County, and another 600-700 acres in Cass County, which is devoted to the purpose of well fields to serve, who? Just the city of Lincoln. But those well fields are all off of the tax rolls in Saunders County and in Cass County. As I looked at this bill, I thought, this is surely a way to remedy that. And...but it's very, very difficult to remedy. Now, if they lease that ground out, there will be some tax paid. If they either don't lease the ground out because it isn't leasable...if it's in the middle of the river, of course, it wouldn't be. But if they choose not to lease it, that doesn't help the political subdivision that is burdened with the loss of the land from the tax rolls whatsoever. And in the case of Senator Hudkins' district and my district, Saunders County, we have the...we have the MUD well field land, which is roughly some 1,200 acres, that will keep about 40 wells. And the land at the present time is rented out, so there will be a tax paid.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: But if the day comes...and I'm told that it will...that that land is not leased, because they simply don't...they simply want to protect the area for well head protection and so forth, then there will be no benefit and no tax paid. And I have to look at...I'm going to run out of time, but I want to talk to Senator Wickersham, and I'll do that later, about the in lieu of tax payment under those circumstances, where the land is not used...is not leased out, is used for wells, but they still will need the public services of the fire and roads and so forth. Will they pay a payment for those services? I guess we'll continue with that discussion. But this behooves us, I think, to look at some of these questions now. Fortunately, I think, with the...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BROMM: ...delayed implementation of the bill, we'll be able to continue to look at it next session. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith on the Landis amendment.
