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Senator Hudkins is trying to deal with a situation where you don't have...where you don't have a road closed for repair or maintenance and where you don't have a law enforcement officer on the scene at that moment, because a law enforcement officer could say, stop, wave their flashlight, whatever. If you proceed, you're violating a lawful order and you'll be penalized accordingly. And that is a misdemeanor. What Senator Hudkins is trying to do is to deal with the situation where you have...the most likely example is the one she gave. You have an accident, you have people helping such as fire department people, rescue people who are stopping traffic to avoid a hazardous situation or to complicate what's already a bad situation, and asking people to cooperate in that respect. Now in this situation she described, a semi decided that either they...I don't think they didn't see the person telling them to stop because they had a fire truck crossways along the side of the road trying to partially block traffic. They were waving and had the proper clothing, but they chose to go on around them and go through the scene of the accident. She's trying to close that loophole or that dangerous situation. And I've spoken with her about possibly amending it to provide that that's an infraction rather than a misdemeanor. Now that has its own set of questions perhaps but it would then be a fine of up to \$100. I think the person who witnesses that would have to...Senator Chambers and I were talking about that...would have to swear out a complaint or file a report. The county attorney would have to evaluate whether or not he could prove the case and whether or not he had enough information to even...you know, if the person doesn't stop, I'm not sure how they're going to find out who to issue the complaint to, but hopefully through investigation, that could be determined. So she's trying to fill that void or that hole, which happens quite often. And Senator Baker or others who have been involved in emergency situations, I'm sure recognize that. That's the intent and so I don't know if that helps clarify it for anyone but that's...I wanted to at least suggest that. Senator Hudkins, do you...do you have anything to add? Do you care to use the rest of my time?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Thank you, Senator Bromm. I appreciate the time. Just to comment to what Senator Crosby had said. We
