wasn't exactly sure what we were doing as far as the passenger compartment, but I think he clarified that, so with that I will yield my time back to the Chair. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schmitt. Senator Bromm, there are no further lights. Would you wish to close on your AM1430 to LB 585?

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you very much, Mr. President. And I do...I do sincerely appreciate the discussion and what I'm doing, I would ask for your support on the amendment and I'm having legal counsel check on the advisability and ramifications of removing the words, ethyl alcohol and ethanol, either or both, and I think I'll have an answer on that before we get done with the next couple of amendments. And if we can come back and if the body would like to, I'm certainly willing to do that. It's not...you know, this isn't intended to be the kind of thing that's overreaching or ridiculous and...but I do want to do it right with the definitions and so forth, as long as we're going through the process. So that's what I would represent to the body and I would ask for your support in the adoption of the amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. You've heard the closing on AM1430 to LB 585. The question before the body is, shall the Bromm AM1430 be adopted to 585? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted that care to? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bromm's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Bromm amendment is adopted. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.
