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and it also only applies to Class III and Class IV's. If the lobby is opposed, and I assume they may be, I believe their opposition, as I said before, is really tunnel vision, because I think it could serve the industry well. I think it can...as I said, it certainly serves the people who want to seek information and will have no forum. And as Senator...other senators have indicated, they were speaking like they thought that the people would have an opportunity. Counties, boards cannot call for a public hearing if there's no zoning in place. And so, Senator Stuhr, that couldn't happen in these counties. There wouldn't be a forum. And those 66 applications probably came from counties that had zoning or would have interim zoning. So as I said, this is in a very limited, limited situation. But I do think, to those people who live in those counties with no interim zoning, that it's something that we should do. I do want to clear up also...this is from DEQ...DEQ does not oppose public hearings for livestock facilities. We already have public hearing requirements for most of our other programs. Let me repeat that. We already have public hearing requirements for most of our other programs. I think that's very important. It's not like we're asking DEQ to do something that is not something that they normally do. We will defer to the Legislature on this issue. You may also recall that the Environmental Quality Council sent the Natural Resources Committee a letter in...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...late March, recommending consideration of public hearings. And so for those of you who think DEQ are opposed to this, this says that they are not. For those of you who think that there is ample opportunity, as on the previous amendment, for the public to come forward, I would suggest that I agree with that, in those counties that are zoned or have interim zoning. But for those people in those few counties who do not have that, I believe that this is reasonable. I think that for the industry, it serves them well; I think for DEQ, it serves them well; and certainly for the people. I do not present this as an obstructionist. As most of you know, Jon and I are farmers. We support the industry, we support...
