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that she doesn't want to charge any nonsmoker part of the price for carrying out that task. It's certainly a valid point. I'm not sure it's the only way you could look at that issue. It is a societal issue so those of us who smoke or don't smoke certainly are involved and I think, arguably, could be asked to carry part of the burden. The need for public policy intervention here, maybe several points could be made here. I think it's clear that there is a lessening of tolerance among the public for smoking. It's happened over a long period of time, airlines, public buildings and so on. There's more and more evidence that citizens don't want to be around cigarette smoking. Now, certainly you can't argue that the lack of tolerance is a public policy goal. We certainly don't want to do that. But, certainly, I think you need to recognize it as a trend as regards smoking and tobacco use. There is certainly a growing body of medical evidence. I think that is without question. I don't know that anybody has mentioned it specifically, but one important area, as far as I'm concerned is the impact of women smoking during pregnancy. I don't know...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...exactly how you attack that, but I certainly think that's an important...important area to worry about. I would mention also that there's sort of some common sense reasons for intervention. Addiction I think is no longer a question. I think even the tobacco companies admit that this is certainly a reaction to tobacco. I would...I would mention then, finally, coming to my decision, many of us don't want to take an extreme position, and that would include even those of us who are not Independents. This, I think, is a moderate position, a moderate approach. The use of money is directed toward the problem. There is a sunset. This is a trial period. We're going to try it for awhile, see how it works and then reevaluate it, and there is also...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...significant evidence to suggest that it will work. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Senator Suttle,
