statement about abortion every time he gets the opportunity and I do not begrudge him that opportunity, and there will be some situations where it will be, in my opinion, appropriate for me to engage him in extended discussion about the issue and subject of abortion. But this bill is not about abortion. If you will read the bill itself and see the explanation and the detailing of what the Women's Initiative is designed to do and achieve, you will see that abortion has nothing to do with it. I believe that the comment relative to abortion which is in the bill now was put there to reassure people that this is not a secret attempt, hatched by some shadowy conspirators, to bring upon the state favoring of abortion, although I favor a woman's right to make the choice, always have, always will, believe it's nobody's business except the woman and her physician. I pointed out to my colleague, "Baron" Tyson, how Nebraska is among those states, in an article which talked about those strongly antiabortion states being the stingiest when it comes to assistance for children, and that bears out my position. People are interested in zygotes, embryos, and fetuses but not children. This is one of the stingiest states when it comes to children. It has one of the highest rates of infant mortality. That means children in the world who die. And where are these antichoice people on that? Why isn't "Baron" Tyson and those others standing up on this floor saying, we need to do something about infant mortality rates in this state. But, no, they feel safe in talking about fetuses because that costs the state nothing and gives them the opportunity to intrude into the lives of women whom they basically hate. There is a hatred of women in this country and women even join in in the same way that black people have been discriminated against to such an extent that self-hatred is inculcated in black people. If I were not as I am, I wouldn't be mistreated as I am, so I hate what I am and I hate others who are like me, because the more of them there are...

And there's that division in the individual, the ego falls apart and disintegrates, and every manner of psychological problem emerges, and those are similar things that happen to women and women will allow themselves to be demeaned
