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it horticultural property, so there are...in LB 1124 we do have another definition for production agriculture land that has to do with what it's used for, not a dollar value, not a size, but if it is part of an income-producing agricultural or horticultural enterprise. The five or more contiguous acres is...and you see down at the bottom it says, as an income-producing agricultural enterprise, as separate from residential property or commercial property. But the five acres is a figure that we found rather consistently in the other statutes that we read across...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...the heartland. No particular emphasis on size.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay. So, the assessor would determine the...would determine whether this applied, not only by looking at the acreage parameters, but at the usage of the real estate. Is that fairly accurate?

SENATOR COORDSEN: That's fairly accurate, yes.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR COORDSEN: And again, that is, I would again re-emphasize the reason why I believe that this particular amendment is an appropriate one to have a public hearing as part of the other bill.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Because this is quite serious language meanings.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Senator Coordsen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President, members of the body, I still would like to ask Senator Coordsen a couple questions and see if he could answer me.
