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and it might be the basis to want to at least move it to Select File...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Time.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...later today.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Senator Crosby, followed by Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. President and members. And, Senator Chambers, if you are...whomever you are in that little Star Trek ship, you have to think maybe I'm just out here in a row boat, and I don't even know how to row. So I'm not of the Star Trek generation, I guess. I still think we have to take things in a reasonable way and try to overcome whatever doubts we have to help people that feel that they need help. Now we're down to...I'm not sure where we are, and I'm not going to speak very long for that very reason, because Senator Kristensen is going to speak again, and I think Senator Beutler, to tell me what conclusions some of you have decided to come to. One of the things I do not like is rewriting legislation on the floor. And Senator Bohlke said some of the things that I feel, is that we bring something to the floor, and then we decide we don't like it, so we're going to start rewriting it. Also to say that it came out of committee with the idea that it wouldn't go anywhere, that's a ridiculous thing to say about a committee. If you thought it wouldn't go anywhere, then why did you people vote to bring it out of committee? Why didn't you vote no, that you didn't think it would go anywhere or that it should not? There was only one no vote against it coming out of committee. So some of those people must have had some idea that we should be trying to look at the joint custody laws and the parenting act and the parenting plans to help those people that feel that they need help. We legislate every day on this floor for perhaps a small segment of the population in different disciplines. So this is no different for me. There are people out there who are suffering emotionally because they feel they are cut off from their children, through no fault of their own, or perhaps through a fault of their own. But surely reasonable people, if we give them some kind of tool, a legal tool, and I know that lawyers don't even...they don't like joint custody
