continue to do it. And if this bill takes the rest of the session, I don't care. What I've been asked by a lot of people is this, and some of you all know who you are, and there have been quite a few, what is there about this bill that keeps it on the floor? And I said, it's because the Legislature is trying to teach me a lesson, that's why it stays on the floor, or it's because "Governor" Radcliffe has so much power over the senators, maybe some are not going to be flown here, there and other...everywhere, maybe they're not going to be given memberships to country clubs, whatever it is that "Governor" Radcliffe has that he dangles in front of the senators. Maybe he's promised to help them on bills or hurt them on others. But in reality it's not my job to determine why bills stay on the agenda. It is not mine, Senator Aguilar, to reason why, mine is but to do or die, and I'm doing this so that a bill might die, I am doing what I'm supposed to do, and I will do it today and I'll do it tomorrow, and I'll do it the next day. And in the meantime, I have some colleagues who are so naive still, so sincere in thinking that this bill can be improved, thinking that, if you strike that doubling of the security deposit, something of value will have been done. Well, no, you will have left the garbage in place. I'm stealing some of that colorful language of Senator Hilgert. Usually he's not quite that creative and imaginative, but I like that word, I like that word. You're still going to allow the landlords to steal that security deposit, no accounting required. I've sat in various committees and I've listened to groups come. You ought to see all the letters I'm getting from farmers and farmers' wives, telling how glad they are that I'm here, and how that I work to help them protect themselves. Well, I got some city tenants that I need to look out for, and the farmers are going to have to have their farm senators help them. That's fair, isn't it, Senator Cudaback? Senator Cudaback is not making (laughter) any sign at all. As the Bible said, this is a time when a wise man keeps silent and still. But look, there is one of me, there is one of me, so why should I look out for the urban people and the rural people who have to rent and the farmers, too? How many farm area senators are there in here? How many rural senators are there in here? What do you need me for? So, I've got to start focusing better. I thought we had some kind of understanding, brothers and sisters. I thought we were doing away with the rural-urban split. I thought the country mouse
