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SENATOR BYARS: Correct.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And now this would encompass all Medicaid patients getting...

SENATOR BYARS: This includes testing...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...this mandated thing.

SENATOR BYARS: ...testing of every infant and not just high-risk.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And even though then the private sector, primarily, is not doing this at all?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes, they are doing it, but it's just hit and miss. It's been just a matter of choice, as far as the hospitals and as far as the pediatricians are concerned, on whether they are asking the testing to be done. So, yes, it is being done. Bergan Mercy, in Omaha, I know is doing it on...I think they are doing it on most of their babies. Some of the Lincoln hospitals are also, but, again, it's hit and miss.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Who makes that decision, the hospital, the gynecologist, the parent, the mother?

SENATOR BYARS: It could be any...it won't be the hospital, well, it could be the hospital. It could be all three of those, individually or collectively.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, I am going...I know we're on the subject, I mean on the statute change, but I call the attention of the body to the fiscal note, which is in your blue books or in your bill books, if nothing else. And, you know, it's one of these wonderful things,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...and I guess I'll let you make that decision. As I interpret it, it's a couple hundred thousand to get started. There's some annual operating costs. Additional staff will be needed to track children and provide education.
