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gasoline powered. What becomes of all this talk of progress? What becomes of American ingenuity and these other people being able to cut the mustard or seeking a different line of work? I have not been persuaded that this helps the consumer when everything involved is going to add a cost and the consumer is going to pay it and that's supposed to benefit the consumer? I don't see it. Just like an executioner would tell me, Ernie, I can cure all your headaches forever if you let me cut your head off. I say, no, brother, I'd rather work with the headaches on my own.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Kristensen, on the Bromm amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. Senator Chambers, I read...the question that you had with Senator Bromm, I read a little differently. I want to...I want to give you my take and if you want to respond I'd be glad to do that. When you were talking about the provide repairs pursuant to the warranty, I assume what you were talking about is they can do it, but they void the warranty. That...that becomes the issue, is that, sure, that what...the first part of that sentence says that if you're, and that's on page 15 at the bottom, if the dealer isn't the franchisee of the...or the...the manufacturer, so let's say what you like...you're a Honda dealer or you're a Honda person. Okay. So if it's not a Honda, a manufacturer franchised Honda dealer or a distributor of Honda, which is the line make vehicle so...of Hondas, because those people are under contract with Honda, if it's not those people then the dealer notifies him in writing that the dealer is responsible, jointly and severally, for compliance of the laws. I assume those are the laws that you deliver the title, you know, what...the odometer statements, some of those mechanical things. What the dealer has got to tell them so they don't get confused is that that dealer, because that could be a used car dealer or that could be a Chevrolet dealer that's delivering your Honda, that they can't do the repairs or inspections under the manufacturer's warranty. Because they could, if they didn't have that, that old Chevrolet dealer should say, well, those Hondas aren't that...I can fix that. But if he does then I think he voids your warranty. That's the scary part to me, is that if you don't have them
