amendment, so I'm not going to make any more comments about this because I...but I would say this bill has an impact potentially beyond car dealerships and car franchises if we were to carry it out into other areas. Would that be...could that be said to be true? I mean not...not unless we pass the other bills, I mean, but...I know this confines it only to automobile dealerships at this point, but in the bigger picture and scheme of things if we start limiting dealerships and ownerships here we probably could carry this into other areas of business potentially because of the passage of this bill.

SENATOR BROMM: I've tried to think about that a little bit, Senator Wehrbein, and I'm having a hard time finding things that are regulated as franchise agreements are, perhaps liquor licenses. It would have to be a regulated...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: How about fast foods?

SENATOR BROMM: I don't...well, franchise agreements between...between the parent company and...I...possibly, although we don't have the same kind of laws that seem to regulate that like we do...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR BROMM: ...car dealership franchises.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I may get into that when we get later, but...

SENATOR BROMM: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...I kind of want to get thinking about this because I feel it may have far-reaching ramifications beyond this amendment and I want to confine it at this point to the amendment. Thank you.
