CLERK: Mr. President, LB 1018 introduced by the Transportation Committee and signed by a number of its members. (Read title.) Bill was introduced in January, referred to Transportation, advanced to General File, discussed yesterday, Mr. President. When the Legislature adjourned there was pending an amendment to the bill by Senator Bromm, AM2348. (AM2348, Legislative Journal page 605.)

SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, would you like to update us on AM2348 to LB 1018? We're kind of...

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...to get us back on track.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Yesterday, the pending amendment was AM2348 and we pretty much discussed various parts of the bill, but I will focus on trying to bring the body up-to-date on AM2348. AM2348 amends three parts of the bill. On page 12, line 17, is a clarifying amendment which simply says that: A franchise agreement with a Nebraska licensed dealer which conforms to and is subject to these sections of the motor vehicles statutes and this section is not control for purposes of this section. In other words, nothing we're doing here would be violated by a standard franchise agreement between a dealer and a manufacturer. It's just a clarifying amendment. Then, on page 15 is the second part of the amendment, line 23, another I think an improvement in language which takes out the words "requires or allows" and inserts "which does not take place in the state of Nebraska provides for" delivery in the state of Nebraska. This bill...this bill is intended to take care of the situation or prevent the situation where the...where the manufacturers come in and try to assume ownership of all...all the dealers or control all the dealers.
