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language in order to prevent that is to focus on delivery, at least that...that is our conclusion, and so this focuses on delivery. If the transaction does not take place in Nebraska and delivery isn't in Nebraska, this bill doesn't apply, and that's clarified by this language. This language in the amendment provides that if the transaction for the sale doesn't take place in Nebraska but it does provide for delivery in Nebraska then the parameters of this bill will apply. And then the third thing on this amendment, page 17, line 5, we take out the word "a" and put in the words "an existing" franchisee, which I think is just clarifying that we're talking about the existing franchises with respect to that language. So that is an explanation of the amendment. Thank you, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm, for bringing us up-to-date. We are now open for debate on AM2348 to LB 1018. The lights are on, on Senator Kristensen and Senator Chambers. Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Yesterday, we had some discussions about what this bill was really all about and I think there was some general discussions concerning what are some of the benefits of having a bill like this and how...what concerns would we have. Does this start the whole merry-go-round of every business doing this sort of activity? I bought a card, I don't think I have it with me this morning, it's a calling card and part of it is that when I want to call home during the legislative session I can use that card, and so I bought it over the Internet. Found...I did my shopping, discovered a good deal that I thought. It had plenty of disclosure. I found that it met my needs. Some have those hidden little charges, some have monthly maintenance fees, but I bought a couple of the cards. The trouble is that you get the cards, the 800 number that you dialed is no good. It's disconnected. So what do I do with that? Where...who is the seller? Well, the seller occurred far away, I think in Maryland, so what are my recourses? Well, I can get mad and try to call the fellow. That will do a lot of good, and there will be a lot of those excuses. But where is the dispute? Who do I go to? Who do I...who do I try to get this worked out with? If I would have bought it from, let's say, a local convenience shop, I'd go back and talk to the manager. I'd go talk to the
