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this bill is exactly what I think we need. I think the creativity, the thoughtfulness behind the whole bill is excellent, I have no problem with it whatsoever. But I do have a problem in this way in taking dollars from the Excellence in Health Care Trust Fund that a previous body set aside to be granted in a different way. I agree completely with Senator Jensen, that this is a prime candidate. I urged Senator Bohlke, when she asked me to sign onto this bill originally, to go to the Trust Fund Board and make application for these dollars. It couldn't be a better place or better spent dollars, there's no question about it. But 43 members of this body debated LB 1070 on how we would set up the Excellence in Health Care Trust Fund and made a very careful, learned decision at that time that we would not do what we're doing this morning, that we would make application to that trust fund for the dollars and how we would spend them. Now I am the first one that says there are health care issues outside of that venue that this body still needs to look at, analyze, and make a good public policy decision on whether we want to fund it from General Fund dollars or other places. But I'm extremely concerned that we're subverting the process. It's such a good bill but, if we pass it, what kind of precedent does that set for every other issue that follows it? I'm very, very concerned. I would probably be one senator who would vote in favor of General Fund dollars being used to fund this in the event that we didn't...the money couldn't be gotten from the Health Care Trust Fund. But I suspect, knowing the goals of the Trust Fund Council, one of them is tobacco education; it's a strong goal of them to fund this very type of issue. And without having either even gone through the process, I'm extremely concerned again about us subverting LB 1070, the 43 members, including Senator Bohlke, voted for in the past Legislature. Now can we change? You bet you; if we've got 25 votes, we can do anything we want to, there's no question about it. But is this truly the proper way to do it? I...I implore you, this is a good piece of legislation. It's extremely hard to stand here and oppose the funding mechanism, but I have to do so. I hope that you'll look at this very guardedly, understand what you're doing. I remember very clearly Senator Warner standing on this floor time and time again, I remember him getting me off on the side of the Chamber and counseling me on looking only at the moment and not looking globally and not looking at the future, and I very definitely
