ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote, Legislative Journal pages 806-807.) 34 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the balance of the report, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The report is adopted. We next move to the Government, Military and Affairs (sic) Committee's confirmation report. Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, that report is found in the Journal on page 774.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: The Chair of the Government Committee, Senator Schimek, you're recognized to open on the confirmation report.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. The Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee desires to report favorably upon the appointment of Mr. Samuel F. Seever to the State Personnel Board. I was going to say Sam Seever, and leave it to Senator Chambers to ask whether this was Samuel or Samantha, but after the discussion on the last appointment, I thought I better make it clear. Mr. Seever came before the committee, we had a good hearing, and I would like to give you just a few significant points in his background. From 1970 to 1976 he was a practicing attorney in Superior, Nebraska. From '76 to '79 he was Executive Director of Public Relations for the United States Jaycees. From '79 to '81 he was Executive Director of the Idaho Bar Association. From '81 to '83, National Sales Manager, Harris Laboratories; from '83 to '86, Director of Agronomic Services, Harris Labs. And finally, from 1986 to the present he's been General Counsel of MDS Harris, here in Lincoln, Nebraska. He is a resident of Lincoln, Nebraska. He does have many activities and professional awards and honors listed on his resume. I think he is highly desirable and qualified. I would recommend a favorable, a favorable vote on this particular nominee. Thank you.
