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orders, that they be subject to fine rather than a withholding of this Universal Service Funding money. Now, when we get to the committee amendment, I'm going to suggest a division of that committee amendment. Let me tell you that the bill...the committee amendment as it came out of committee with the bill does one more thing than what I have described to you, one more thing in imposing administrative fine. It changes the law with respect to the effective date of a Public Service Commission order. As the law stands right now, if there is a contested hearing before the Public Service Commission and the commission comes down on the side of one party or the other and enters an order finding for that party, if that order is appealed by the losing party, the Public Service Commission order does not go into effect until that appeal has been heard and decided by the court. That has...can have quite a detrimental effect on the authority and the impact of a Public Service Commission order. If I am the entity that loses that administrative or that hearing before the Public Service Commission, that contested hearing, and if it means quite a bit of money to me, it would be only a good business judgment on my part to appeal that order, because the final decision by the court probably would be months, if not a year or two down the line. In the meantime, I can continue to reap the benefits of the actions that the Public Service Commission deemed to be wrong. And even if the court reverses the decision at a later time I have reaped the benefit of that for months, if not...if not years by the time it goes through the court system. So the second part of the amendment, and this is LB 1240, by the way, that was amended in regarding the effective date of Public Service Commission orders. LB 1240 was amended into the committee amendment, so that's what that is, if you want to look at LB 1240. We did amend the original provisions of LB 1240 significantly to insert more of a due process administrative act procedure for dealing with this effective date of the commission order. And I will explain that in more detail when we get to that part of the amendment. I want to tell you, and, Senator Cudaback, when it gets...when it gets time to debate the committee amendment, I am going to ask that the amendment be divided and that these two issues that I have very briefly described, the one being the fining authority of the commission, the second issue being the effective date of the commission order, that those two questions be divided for consideration by this body. And I think that's appropriate. I
