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after a while they went to the group of people who were running a petition and they said, would you please submit someone that you like to the candidacy for the village board. Well, they couldn't come up with anyone. So, therefore, the village went about their business again and tried to elect someone again. They were recalled. So what happened to that village, they unincorporated, this disbanded, I mean they gave up their village charter because they couldn't find (laugh) find anyone that would satisfy this group of people to be on the board. It didn't make any difference who it was. So...and that's what we were trying to work with in committee this year on the particular bill that I had. I don't want to stray away from Senator Smith's bill, but these are some of the things you need to know about recalls, not that I would ever take that right to recall away, that...that's the furthest thing from my mind. But I do think that there should be some guidelines in place so that these kind of things can't happen. Just because you don't like the color of the person's hair or you don't like his dog or his wife or her husband, that...you know, these are the kind of things that I think we need to safeguard against. And the particular bill that I had we could not get the language quite right; we'll probably work on it some more to see if we can get it in the correct order. But those are just some of the things that I wanted to discuss on the floor. This is the first time that I can recall we've ever had the chance to discuss it here on the legislative floor. That's all I have. Thank you, Senator Chambers, for giving me the time.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schimek, you're recognized to close on the committee amendments.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Just very briefly, I don't want to take much time. The main thing the committee amendments does is change some notification provisions and...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time is expired.
