But there is nothing sinister in this amendment and perhaps the only thing that raised Senator Quandahl's skepticism is the fact that I'm supporting what Senator Stuhr is doing. But, Senator Stuhr, I assure you this is not a situation where the dish is going to run away with the spoon.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion on the motion? Seeing none, Senator Stuhr, would you like to close? Senator Stuhr waives closing. The question is suspension of the rules so we can do Final Reading on LR 20CA. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

CLERK: 47 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, to suspend the rules and permit consideration of LR 20CA on Final Reading today.

SENATOR CROSBY: The motion is successful. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LR 20CA on Final Reading.)

SENATOR CROSBY: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 972.) 48 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. The bill is passed. Okay, Mr. Clerk, we'll go to the motion on LB 510.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Chambers would move to reconsider the vote on his motion with respect to overriding the Governor's line-item...I'm sorry, the Governor's veto of LB 510.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. Clerk.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open.
