definition of the act, what's involved in the act, and then there's one paragraph that defines what a manufactured home is. That's simply all it is. With that, I'd like to urge you to adopt this amendment. And I'd yield the rest of my time to Senator Bromm to explain LB 1419. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, there's about eight minutes left.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you. Thank you, Senator Kremer. In the same area that Senator Kremer is speaking of, in the Transportation and Telecommunications Committee we had a very, very short, almost a one-liner bill, LB 1419, that had no opposition and that was advanced by the committee without any dissenting vote, which basically changed a couple words to require that anyone who's attempting to do business, like selling automobiles at the State Fair and trade shows within the state, that they would have to be licensed and subject to the requirements and regulations of the Motor Vehicle Licensing Board, so that someone couldn't come in on a three-day or five-day situation and sell some vehicles and skip the state and not be subject to any of these requirements. They would either have to...they could get a license through the Licensing Board, or they could I'm sure work through a dealer that already is licensed. And this has apparently not been required. The state of Iowa has this similar provision, and my understanding is that so do Colorado, Missouri and South Dakota. And this seems like a very minor change, but it is something that I think is important enough to do. It was...it is a bill, it did have a hearing. Like I say, there was no opposition. I would hope that the body could see fit to adopt this amendment which includes Senator Kremer's portion and LB 1419. Thank you.
