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discussions with Senator Schimek and also Senator Beutler about this issue. As you recall when we were on the floor last time when we were discussing this bill, there was some concern which I expressed about the fact that we were putting all of the liability and the responsibility for filing fees upon the treasurer for any kind of a campaign. And while that might be very, very appropriate in a ballot initiative, if we're talking about a candidate's campaign, in those cases most of the time the treasurer is serving in a voluntary capacity. They're not being reimbursed for their efforts. They're doing it really out of the goodness of their heart and they're taking their own spare time to do it. And so it was a concern to me that we were resting all of the liability upon the treasurer, who has been a friend to the candidate, rather than on the candidate himself. I believe, personally, that the candidate is responsible for the people they hire, whether they pay them or whether they work on a voluntary basis. The candidate themselves is responsible to see that things are filed on time and to see that, in fact, everything is correct. I think the treasurer serves a good purpose. It's a double-check. It's a safeguard for the public to know that someone else has checked those records and made sure that they're accurate. But that's what it really should serve as, as a service to the candidate to make their job easier and also as a double-check. As I visited with some of the members in the body, there was a concern expressed by them as well that they might lose the services of their volunteer treasurer if they were going to risk this kind of liability, and so what we did is we put together an amendment. The first amendment that we put together I will be...we ran it by Accountability and Disclosure and they were a little concerned with the language that Bill Drafters had done, which is why we are back with AM2490. This was worked out between Accountability and Disclosure and the Bill Drafters Office. What it does is it rests the liability entirely upon the candidate. That does not mean that a candidate must fill out the forms themselves. You have the right and the responsibility to delegate, if you so choose, to have someone else fill those out. But if, in fact, they are in error or that they're not filed in time it would be the candidate's responsibility. I'm hoping that you're all in agreement that the candidate should take responsibility for their own campaign and to make sure that these things are filed on time. There could be some other
