limitations. These districts also have a difficult time raising funds for buildings due to the large amounts of federal property that are not on the tax rolls. The lop-off for most districts, 90 percent of the resources for General Fund expenditures in most districts, come from property taxes and state aid. The other 10 percent of the resources for General Fund expenditures in most districts come from other resources, and those resources must be used for General Funds. The lop-off for districts with large amounts of federal land, 75 percent of the resources for General Fund expenditures come from property taxes and state aid, and 25 percent of the resources for General Fund expenditures come from impact aid, which can be shifted to building funds and the funds could be shift...and the funds could be shifted to building funds. This has caused a problem. This corrects the problem that the Indian schools have been having with the lop-off. And with this technical amendment, doing this, it should be able to generate them more money and they will be able to use the impact aid for their buildings. As I said, I will make a copy of this and give it all...give it to you. Really, the discussion probably would be more proper on the A bill, but I did want everyone to know that, although it's a technicality, we were then told when they did the A bill for this that it did have a significant impact that could mean a million to a million and a half more dollars flowing to the Indian schools.
