SENATOR JANSSEN: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Brown. (Visitors introduced.) The next speaker is Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I would yield a moment of time to Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR JANSSEN: (Microphone malfunction)...Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Sorry to bother you, Mr. President, but (laughter) thank you. Members of the body, I am continuing to support the extension of the commission's life for six months, but I think I can read the mood of the body. Senator Smith has indicated that if I will withdraw my amendment to the amendment that he likewise can read the mood of the body and that he will withdraw his amendment. So, Mr. President, to expedite proceedings, I would ask that my amendment to the amendment be withdrawn and I will yield time back to Senator Smith.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. I would like to just say two things and then pull the amendment. Oftentimes it takes us more time to get things going than we estimated in the beginning. That's unfortunate. And I do believe that this body has done some good work, but with that I will withdraw the amendment. I thank you for your time and I know my esteemed senior colleague Senator Landis thanks you for your time as well. Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: The amendment is withdrawn.
