levy, if you recall, a year ago. Asbestos removal at Wayne State College, \$375,000; that's over the estimate because the asbestos was much more friable than we had thought it was going to be, and so we have additional expense to remove, at this point, the asbestos at Wayne. The Wilderness Camp I think...there's a discussion in here on that. I will say that Kearney is 85 over capacity at this point, Youth Training Center at Kearney. This is an attempt to relieve that. And I want to reemphasize we had intense discussion on the Wilderness Camp, in fact it did not end up in this budget until the last possible minute because it is going to use federal funds. There's hopes that federal funds will continue into the future. But it is very possible, a year from now, that we will have to take it over with General Funds. But it is an effort to relieve the extreme crowding at Kearney. I can't remember the time in Kearney, but it's...right now kids simply go in and out. We can't let the programs work because they are there for such a short time, and this is an effort to provide additional beds for boys, in this case, and it's an effort to try the Wilderness Camp concept. And we can go into great detail, if you care to, on that. There's a value-added initiative in agriculture to try to promote overseas trade. We have the CJIS additional money to finish out that project. District court reporter salary adjustment, this is not a one-time, but it's a one-time for this year. That will be looked at very carefully next year, but court reporters are extremely hard to find and the salary level, salary are very competitive, and this is an effort to relieve that somewhat because several judges at this point do not have report salaries...reporters, I mean, because of either moving onto other jobs or whatever. So we put additional money in there. DED also has a value-added initiative which is similar to agriculture; that's actually joint, they've reallocated some funds internally, and these are additional funds to do that. NETC, the NEB*SAT network three, upgrade equipment. This is an upgrading of equipment that's needed in NETV. DEQ, well, they're getting lesser and lesser, sorry to say, \$180,000 is for the Super Fund sites, remediation, maintenance. Community-oriented police services, this would add six additional patrolmen using federal funds to start with, and this is our share. That will go up in the future. I guess I won't go into more detail on what you see, the rest of those. If there's questions, I'll be...try to answer them.
