

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE  
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SENATOR CONNEALY: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I call Senator Connealy "Senator Conealy" so much that sometimes when I'm not thinking that's what comes out. Senator Connealy, which way, if an amendment were going to be offered, would you rather have it go; make both sections require a 25 percent match or both programs require a 50 percent match?

SENATOR CONNEALY: I would probably 25 percent. I think that was the way we originally drafted it. We moved it up to 50. I would hope that in most of the projects, there will be a larger match than that on the participant's part, but this would be more...we would allow them to have more flexibility, so the 25 would probably be better now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. Clerk, may I ask you a question so that I'm clear on...my amendment, as drafted, would require a 50 percent match in both places, is that correct?

CLERK: Well, Senator, without taking a moment, I'd hate to comment on that. If you give me a moment, I could look.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Sure. Well, if you will read me the way the amendment is drafted, then I will know what it does.

CLERK: Read it to you, you say?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

CLERK: On page 7, Senator,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

CLERK: ...of line 27,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

CLERK: ...it strikes "fifty" and inserts "twenty-five."

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right.
