LB 1260.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay, so...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, they're...

SENATOR RAIKES: ...but it would have to be decided if LB 1260 were in place, right, or LB 968 were in place?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: It could be decided.

SENATOR RAIKES: And how would it be decided?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Somebody would appeal valuations or protest valuations and it would go up through the equalization process or the TERC, as a part of their equalization plan and their review of values in a county, could order changes.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature. I have a question for Senator Wickersham. I was paging through and saw that the Voluntary Emergency Responders Recruitment and Retention Act was found in Section 6...
