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SENATOR CROSBY: I guess that's what I was trying to establish here, that I...

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, and if I could ask...

SENATOR CROSBY: ...that we're not...

SENATOR JENSEN: ...other people to withdraw their amendments I would...I'm doing that right now.

SENATOR CROSBY: Well, I guess maybe it's a message I think everybody needs to look and be sure that...that all those amendments that are still there are not maybe duplications of what we just took out, or maybe some of those bills. I've been trying to go through the Journal and find out.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, I understand.

SENATOR CROSBY: I just thought we should talk about that a little bit to be sure that we understand. And "Christmas treeing" is not a new thing. You didn't think it up, I know, because Mayor Don Wesely was really good at it. (Laughter)

SENATOR JENSEN: It seems to fall within this committee sometimes, but...

SENATOR CROSBY: All right. It...

SENATOR JENSEN: ...but I said I would never do that.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...there must be some...there must be something in the water in that office of yours. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Senator Tyson, on the Thompson amendment.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I'm a member of the Health and Human Services Committee, but Senator Thompson asked me if I would speak on this bill because she knows, number one, of my sentiments generally toward smoking. A few years ago there was a movie entitled
