Monday but the hearing needs to be cancelled. In order to cancel the hearing, we have to suspend the rules to do that. Now is a convenient time to do that, and I'd modify the agenda. If there is somebody who wants some additional time, I'd be...I'd entertain that, but if there is no objection, I would take up and move the agenda at this point to take up that suspension to cancel a hearing on Monday by the Government Committee.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Without objection, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schimek would move to suspend Rule 3, Section 13 to permit cancellation of a public hearing by the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schimek, you're recognized to open.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you. Mr. President and members, this was a very last minute occurrence. We just found out for certain this morning that the person who had been appointed for Accountability and Disclosure Commission is resigning and so he naturally would not care to come to our hearing. We will be having another person, another person's appointment being heard that same day, so the entire hearing won't be cancelled but the hearing on Frank Hayes, who is resigning, needs to be cancelled, and I would appreciate your support of the suspension of the rules.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Debate on the motion to suspend the rules. Senator Schimek, you're recognized to close. Senator Schimek waives closing. The question is, shall the rules be suspended to cancel a hearing? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to suspend the rules to permit cancellation of hearing.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The motion is agreed to.

CLERK: Mr. President, pursuant to that, a notice of cancellation from the Government Committee of a public hearing on a conferee. Subsequent to that, I have a withdraw letter of
