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county board and to say their piece if the county board is considering whether or not the property that they have leased is subject to a public purpose or...and would be exempt from tax, or is potentially subject to tax. I think that's fair to the lessees. It is an issue that we overlooked before. There are provisions that clarify the provisions of LB 968 as adopted on General File. Those were provided to us by the Property Tax Administrator and coordinates various provisions with the equalization of special valued...

SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...land with LB 967. There are provisions in the amendment that clarify the program or the provisions in the LB 968 that dealt with the installment payment of taxes. They were recommended to us by treasurers after they reviewed the provisions that were adopted on General File. I think they're all sensible. Probably the most significant change is the omission of the word "taxpayer" in those provisions and insertion of the notion that it is the person that makes the payment of the taxes that is in control of the account and that would be entitled to both direct disposition of the account and to have the account applied to other purposes in the event the property is sold. There are provisions that change the definition of "mobile home". I remember...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. Thank you, Senator Wickersham. Senator Coordsen, on the Wickersham amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. AM2984 is as Senator Wickersham described it. Primarily, it's in an area that is relatively new in the perspective of law. I do have an amendment to it, to this amendment, that will be coming along in a little bit that falls into the same description, identifying problems that do exist from time to time in our system and to provide correcting mechanisms for that. With that little bit of support, I would tell you that I support AM2984 which is, in fact, a committee amendment to LB 968. Thank you.
