PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. Debate on advancement of LB 812A. Senator Bohlke, you're recognized to close. Senator Bohlke waives closing. The question is the advancement of LB 812A. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 812A.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is advanced. Mr. Clerk, items for the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, a series of study resolutions, LR 476-485, all will be referred to the board. (Legislative Journal pages 1376-1380.) That's all that I have, Mr. President.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President.
