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into the state of Nebraska. We believe that one out of five sites that's being tested now for MTBE contamination has MTBE contamination; the list is just going to continue to grow, and we want to ban MTBE now. I believe the amendment bans MTBE as of July 1st. Senator Preister, I commend you for bringing us that amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Chambers, on the Preister amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Preister a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Preister, would you yield?

SENATOR PREISTER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Preister, in what other products, besides petroleum, would MTBE be found, if you know of any other?

SENATOR PREISTER: Other than petroleum products, Senator Chambers, I don't know of any other.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The only reason I ask is because your amendment says, and I don't think it needs to be changed, it makes specific reference to petroleum products, so I was wondering if there was some other product where it might be used and therefore I ask you the question. But, to your knowledge, it's only found in petroleum products.

SENATOR PREISTER: It was enacted, I believe, through the Clean Indoor Air...Clean Air Act, to deal with the lead in gasoline, and so I believe, to my knowledge, the only place it is in petroleum products.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Connealy, on the Preister amendment.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you, Mr. President. I rise in support
