CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1167A.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 1167A does advance. Mr. Clerk, items for the record?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a hearing notice from the Appropriations Committee; a reference report communication from the Speaker to the Clerk regarding referral of LR 437; Senator Wickersham an amendment to LB 803 to be printed; and Senator Raikes to LB 1234. SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Mr. Clerk, next agenda item.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 925, a bill by Senator Landis. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 5, referred to Revenue, advanced to General File. I have no committee amendments, but a series of amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis, to open.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature. Let me tell you my intention. I think we're down in our numbers and probably down in our enthusiasm, but I'd like to open on the bill and allow us to get at least a modest way into the discussion and then a motion to adjourn, of course, would be appropriate. But by opening, it allows us to make this the open bill on General File and the one we go back to when we come back to General File. Now this bill is not noncontroversial; in fact, it is controversial. And that's why I think we could contemplate some amount of debate on it. The bill came out of the Revenue Committee 5 to 3. The bill is a very simple one as it currently stands. My guess is it will not continue to be as simple as it is now by the time we're all done and it says this.
