is a rush for them to get them all out and they may miss something so that is a good...I can understand that change which would help the department. It also would allow the department to change the due dates on the pickle card dispensing registration by rules and regulation. Right now they, too, all come due on December 31 and that's a lot of work again, once again, for the department to get that change made and they could make the workload more manageable for their employees, and I can understand that. It also amends a section of the Bingo Act which restricts the ability of the department to prove variations of bingo cards only by rule and regulation. This elimination would allow the department to review bingo cards in the same way that they review the pickle cards. And it would also amend the statute to allow the selling of lottery and raffle tickets by qualified, nonprofit organizations at state, district, or county fairs. In reality, this practice is being conducted and these contests are fairly common and widespread throughout the state of Nebraska; and this change would just allow what's been a longstanding practice to be a lawful act rather than the Ladies Aid raffles off a quilt or something at the county fair, why, theoretically that was against the statutes and this would allow that practice that's been on for a long, long time it would make it lawful. It would also amend the powers and duties of the act to provide the department to cancel or suspend or revoke a charitable gaming license when the holder of the license fails to pay the taxes, penalty, or interest imposed upon any of the gaming acts or the Nebraska Department of Revenue Act of 1967. Currently, the failure to pay the taxes in one section is only grounds for denial of a license when it comes up again. They have to wait until that license is due again before they can deny that. This would allow them to suspend that. This would allow for a suspension in the middle of the license period rather than having to wait until renewal comes up again. Finally, it would allow non...small nonprofit organizations to use duck races to determine a winner of a contest raffle. Right now duck races are the only...are only in the licensing portion of charitable gaming. The groups that are too small to go through that very expensive application process for a license are not currently allowed to use duck races for fund raising. This would allow them to do that. We have found out that the wheels that they use to determine the number of the winner are an illegal gaming
