The first amendment that I will be withdrawing that I did want to just visit with you about did propose a...it had actually two parts to it, a grant process that would allow schools to submit their ideas and then in turn receive some additional funding that might assist them in their schools in the areas of career education, vocational, technical education. I felt that and I continue to feel that this is a very important area. I become very concerned when I hear that 4,000 students have dropped out of high school in Nebraska and that we need to provide some kind of education that is appealing to them and that will prepare them, not only for the work force, but also for secondary education, whether that be a community college or a secondary school. Mr. President or Mr. Speaker, I do wish to withdraw the one amendment and I believe then AM3184 would be remaining.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator, if I may right before we do that, Senator Jones, we left the bill last year with an indefinitely postpone motion, but I've been told you want to withdraw that.

SENATOR JONES: Yes, I do.

CLERK: All right, Senator Stuhr, then we're to your amendment I believe that you want to withdraw, Senator, AM3032.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

CLERK: That goes away, if I'm understanding correctly. Then, Senator, I have yours and Senator Bohlke's amendment, AM3184.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Right, yes, I wish to withdraw that.

CLERK: Withdraw that. Okay. Then, Senator, I believe I'm on the amendment you'd like which is AM3193. (Legislative Journal pages 1460-1462.)
