SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. That...that clears up any question that I might have based on, you know, whether or not they are needed. I understand that you've done some research along with Senator Brown and, obviously, I support the idea because I think this is again economic development in the true sense. I was just curious as how you come up with those numbers, but now that you've explained it to me, I get a better picture, that you do have some background that you can fall back on in order to establish those numbers and I appreciate that. So I just wanted to get those particular thoughts that I had in my mind cleared up, and with that, I'm going to support your amendment. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Pursuant to the agenda, we will move to Final Reading at this point. So if members could please return to your desks and...we are on Final Reading. Members could please return to their desks. Mr. Speaker, I understand you'd like to be recognized for an announcement or two.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. If I could have your attention, please, and I'll try to outline some of this also in a memo that's going to go to your offices. As we now are on the 55th day, our days are, obviously, growing short in which to process the state's business. Tomorrow is going to be the last day for a bill on General File. The only exception might be is if we have to...if we have some things that need to...that started and we need to finish up, that can be finished up quickly, that might occur on Thursday, but for all practical purposes, tomorrow is the last day for General File. So the agenda for tomorrow is going to recognize the last stop on some of the committee priority bills, some of the Speaker priority bills, and we're going to...since child support was started today, we're going to put a special time for that to try to get that addressed. There are other issues still left, we're going to try to get those addressed, but tomorrow is the last day for General File. That leaves Thursday and Monday as the last chance for Select File. Now right now we have 19 bills sitting on General File that are either senator priority bills, committee priority bills, or
