LB 1101.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 1101 does advance to E & R Initial. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: LB 1101A by Senator Aguilar. (Read title.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Aguilar, to open on LB 1101A.

SENATOR AGUILAR: LB 1101A is the \$200,000 appropriation needed to support this bill and I urge you to advance it to Select.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Open for discussion on LB 1101A. Seeing no lights on, Senator Aguilar, do you wish to close? He waives closing. The question before the body is, shall LB 1101A be advanced to E & R Initial? All in favor of the question vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 1101A.

SENATOR CUDABACK: LB 1101A does advance. Mr. Clerk, Select File.

CLERK: Mr. President, Select File. LB 659 has been discussed. E & R amendments were adopted. On February 24, amendment by...to the bill by Senator Smith was adopted. First amendment I have this morning is Senator Lynch, AM3206. (AM3206, Legislative Journal page 1475.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Lynch, to open on AM3206 to LB 659. Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. Chairman and members, this amendment contains the original LB 659 as we knew it, which involved a new technology in the process of pickle cards, a legal process, I might add. There was also a bill introduced by Senator Robak that had to do with kenos and, in fact, there was some concern and curiosity about how they were compatible or compatible at all.
