PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I move the advancement of LB 956 to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The question is the advancement of LB 956 to E & R. Those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. The bill is advanced. Mr. Clerk, we will proceed to Final Reading. Mr. Clerk, LB 1004.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 1004. Senator Bromm would move to return the bill for specific amendment, AM3018. (Legislative Journal page 1254.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm, you're recognized to open.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Lieutenant Governor and fellow senators. When LB 1004 made its way back from E & R and we had a note from the Bill Drafting Office about some technical language changes that should be made in order for the bill to read correctly, and this was...actually, we didn't have a chance to do it previously, so this amendment does not change any of the substance of LB 1004, but the language changes, if you read through the amendment, and I think...I think it's been on file since the 23rd of March and in the Journal and so forth, is really, I mean I'll go into each of those language changes, if you wish, but it is to provide consistency and clarity in...in LB 1004 as it applies to out-of-state convictions. And so I'll be glad to try to respond to questions, if there are any, but I can just assure you that it does not change anything in substance. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Debate on the motion to return LB 1004 to Select File? Senator Bromm, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BROMM: I waive closing.
