SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, this is the amendment that would add an African-American to the Lewis and Clark Commission, so I ask that you adopt it. I've discussed it with Senator Wehrbein and others who had an interest in it, so that is all that the amendment will do, and the way it accomplishes it is to say that, instead of five people being appointed, six will be appointed and one will be an African-American. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yeah, support Senator Chambers...Mr. Speaker and members, I support Senator Chambers' amendment. This verifies that he did consult with me, I do consultant work too, and I endorse his amendment as...onto my bill.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close. Senator Chambers exercises his right to waive closing. Those in favor of the Chambers amendment vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to.

CLERK: Senator Wehrbein would move to amend, Mr. President. (AM3273, Legislative Journal page 1554.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wehrbein, you're recognized to open on AM3273.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. This is a very simple little amendment. It's actually LB 1273, but what it does is authorize the Arbor Lodge State Park to accept a gift from the federal government, in this case it's the Corps of Engineers, a maintenance building that will fit very well in with the Arbor Lodge State Park. I had a...if you recall, I had a legislative resolution earlier accepting the gift. This
