an opportunity to do something that is beneficial for families and at the same time save \$1.5 million, that is certainly something that I would advocate that we should do. And that's the part of the bill that I would like to keep available to us. The other part of the bill, which is LB 925, the concept that Senator Landis brought to us, the part of it that is aid to dependent corporations,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...is not something that I think we should advance. And if we advance the bill with the aid to dependent corporations provisions in it, the fiscal note shows us that it actually costs a considerable amount of dollars, that for the Fiscal Year 2000-2001 it's estimated to cost \$1,381,000, that's \$1.4 million almost; in the following years it costs \$1.5 million and then \$1.75 million, very significant fiscal cost, and that's up-to-date with the amendments adopted as of April 4th for this year. So you can either advance something that is aid to dependent corporations with some real benefit to families, because of Senator Hilgert's amendment, or you can just strip out the aid to dependent corporations and still do something for families. I hope you'll support the amendment and strip out the aid to dependent corporations and then go ahead and do something for families.
